## Residential Design Codes (R-Codes) Review

The Western Australian Health Promotion Foundation (Healthway) welcomes the Minister for Planning and Lands' call on the Western Australian Planning Commission (WAPC) to investigate opportunities for modernisation of the R-Codes.

Healthway is the only state agency dedicated to health promotion in WA. The review of the R-Codes has the ability to directly impact three of Healthway's five priority health areas, namely active living, healthy eating and mental wellbeing. Healthway-funded research over a long period has helped to highlight the vital role of the built environment, such as housing density and mixed land-use, in supporting active and mentally healthy communities.
